

In keeping with the Water Environment Association of Ontario (WEAO) New Professionals' (NP) commitment to continuing education through technical development, the WEAO NP Committee is pleased to offer a facility tour of Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP), located at 901 McKay Road, Pickering, Ontario.

The Duffin Creek WPCP is a joint facility between the Regions of York and Durham. It is a conventional activated sludge facility currently rated for an annual average flow of 420 MLD and undergoing expansion to a design flow of 630 MLD.

The purpose of this tour is for New Professionals and students to see a wastewater treatment plant during construction. Our hosts will be North America Construction (1993) Ltd., AECOM, and CH2M HILL, who will lead us on a tour of the Headworks, Electrical Substation, Primary Tanks, Aeration Tanks, and Secondary Clarifiers.

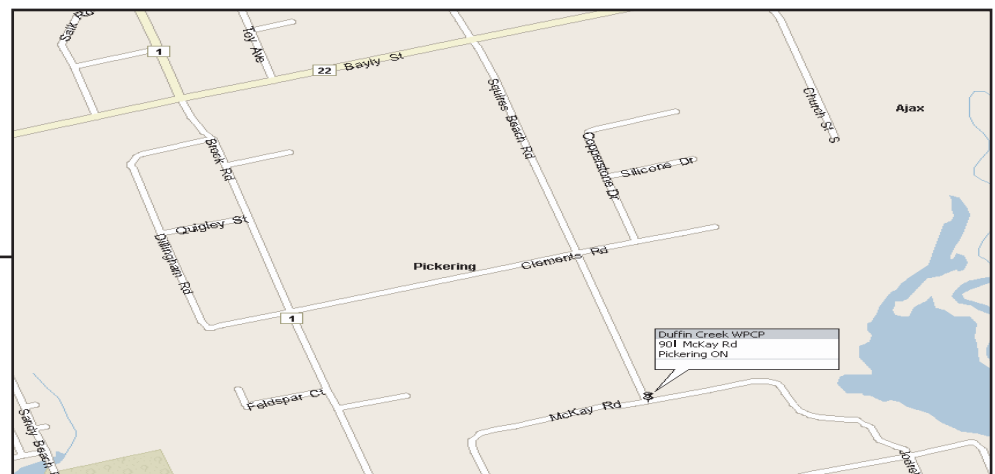
Important notes for participants:

1. Personal protective equipment (PPE) is absolutely required, NO EXCEPTIONS. You must supply your own hard hat, CSA green patch work shoes/boots, traffic vest, and safety glasses. Participants not wearing this PPE will not be allowed on site.
2. You must arrive on time to undergo a mandatory health & safety briefing at the beginning of the tour.
3. This tour is limited to 20 people on a first-come first-served basis.

Participants may also wish to attend the complementary technical seminar "Construction Safety Awareness" on Wed. May 27 (see separate flyer).

Duffin Creek WPCP is located at 901 McKay Rd. in Pickering. From Highway 401, take Brock Rd. exit (Highway 1) south to Bayly St. Turn left (east) on Bayly St. to Squires Beach Rd., make a right (south) on Squires Beach Rd. Continue on Squires Beach Rd. until it ends at McKay Rd. where the Duffin Creek WPCP is located. We will meet in the parking lot in front of the admin building.
